Much of the focus of Florida's budget woes have centered on the equity of Florida's property tax system and the need for significant reform. However, while this focus has been largely on improving conditions of individual homeowners and businesses, another critical area affected by Florida's budget shortfall is the future stability and quality of a major economic engine--Florida's higher education system. In an effort to address proposed cuts, the Florida Board of Governors recently voted to freeze the number of freshman admitted to Florida's public universities for at least three years, defy the self-prescribed authority of the Florida Legislature by increasing tuition, and join a lawsuit filed by former Governor Bob Graham against the Legislature in hopes of clarifying who maintains the authority to set tuition rates. To address these issues and more about the current and future state of higher education in Florida's Board of Governors. As Chancellor in 2005 following the passage by voters of a constitutional amendment establishing Florida's Board of Governors. As Chancellor, he is the senior education official leading a system of 11 public universities, serving more than 293,000 students, with a budget of nearly \$8.5 billion. Please join us on **Friday.
